Projects are offered in the Lone Pine area. All kids ages 5 to 18 are welcome to join 4-H!

A few notes before you begin:

1. To sign up for a project, list the exact project name and leader's name on your enrollment form.
2. Many projects have minimum age requirements that need to be considered.
3. Limited enrollment: if a project is restricted to a certain number of participants, members will be enrolled first come first serve. All members signing up at the Sign Up Fair will be given a spot. If you sign up after the Sign Up Fair, you risk the chance of the project already being full. If more than the maximum number sign up at the Sign Up Fair, we will draw names randomly to fill the slots.
4. There is a \$40 enrollment fee per youth to join 4-H for the entire year. They may take as many projects as they wish. There can be additional project material fees, depending on which project they choose. See the project descriptions for more information.

Parents & Community Members: Would you like to join our group of volunteer project leaders? Do you have a skill or talent that you would like to share? You have the power and ability to make 4-H a meaningful experience for all kids by teaching important life skills. Each volunteer completes an enrollment form, is fingerprinted, and attends a mandatory new volunteer orientation. From there, we'll assist you in planning your meetings.
