Projects being offered in the Independence 4-H Club are listed below.

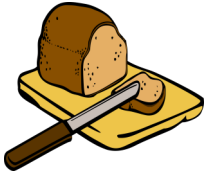
Please write down the project name on your enrollment form.

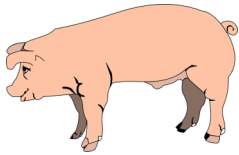
## Beginning Rifle

# Animal Science

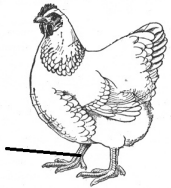


## Market Swine
