Projects being offered in the Lone Pine 4-H Club are listed below.

There is a \$55 enrollment fee per youth to join 4-H for the entire year. They may take as many projects as they wish. Some projects will have additional materials fees, or costs. See the project descriptions for more information.

Animal Science



Advanced Animal Science for Large Animals

Emphasis on marketing your animal for profit. Develop personal integrity, a sense of sportsmanship and team cooperation, and an ability to speak in public through participation in one mandatory public speaking activity. Show their market projects at the Jr. Livestock Show and sell at the auction. This project will have emphases on the large animal project: beef, swine, lambs, and meat and dairy goat. Project costs will vary on the start up cost of the market animal and your feed. Fees will be paid directly to the breeder and you will be responsible for purchasing feed, supplies, and housing of your animal. If you arrange housing with an outside party then you will follow their rules. This project will have strict rules on parent involvement.



Advanced Animal Science for Small Animals

Learn how to care for and show your animal. This project will emphasize the small animals projects: pygmy goat, poultry, market turkey, rabbit and meat pen rabbit. The culmination of the project will be the Junior Livestock Show. Some of these animals will need to be housed year round. Project costs will vary on the start up cost of the market animal and your feed. Fees will be paid directly to the breeder and you will be responsible for purchasing feed, supplies, and housing of your animal. If you arrange housing with an outside party then you will follow their rules. This project will have strict rules on parent involvement.



Western Horsemanship:

Learn the basics of horsemanship. This project will be using horses from a local pack station to teach body parts, proper handling, and riding basics.



Mini members:

Welcome to 4H! A wonderful way to learn how clubs work, do various projects ranging from simple crafts to learning how to raise animals! **you can raise a chicken, goat or rabbit while being a mini member**

Ages 5-8 Learning how 4H works: teamwork, communication with others, self-motivation & team building skills, and early record book keeping. Meetings will be held once a month starting November 2018- June 2019 We will have at least one field trip, TBD on when and where.



Sewing:

Ever wonder how to sew using a sewing machine? This class is for beginner level sewing. We will be learning the basics, choosing a pattern, and learning how to read a pattern. What fabrics will work best for your project, and how to pick out the right supplies. Still working on schedule – Ages: 7-18

Gardening:

Learn gardening basics and get your hands dirty. Learn to grow food and how to start plants from seed, transplant plants and water and feed plants.



Code Your World:

Code Your World is a four-part challenge that teaches kids ages 8-14 to apply CS to the world around them through hands-on activities. Developed by Google and West Virginia University Extension Service, it includes a computer-based activity on Google's CS First platform and three unplugged activities that bring coding to life through games and interaction.
